Music:

The children will learn and perform the Viking chant Starka Virna.

Children will then compose their own Viking chants adding instrumentation to their compositions.

Science:

Properties and changes of materials

We will compare and group everyday materials on the basis of their properties. We will investigate dissolving and separating. We will give reasons for the particular use of everyday materials. We will identify and demonstrate reversible and irreversible changes.

Computing and Technology:

Purple Mash unit 6.3—Spreadsheets.

We will investigate probability, calculate discounts and create a formula to help with this, create a spending and savings spreadsheet and plan a school charity day using a spreadsheet.

Maths:

Area, perimeter, position and direction.

Pupils explain how to calculate the area of a parallelogram and a triangle.

Pupils explain why shapes can have the same perimeters but different areas and vice versa.

Pupils describe positions on the full coordinate grid (all four quadrants)

Pupils draw and translate simple shapes on the coordinate plane and reflect them in the axes

Fractions and percentages

Pupils explain reason and apply their knowledge of how to write a fraction in its simplest form by solving addition, subtraction and multiplication problems.

Pupils explain, using an image, how to add related fractions (unit fractions)

Pupils explain what is meant by 'related fractions' and know how to add and subtract them.

Pupils use their fraction sense to fraction addition, subtraction and comparison

Pupils explain how to add or subtract non-related fractions with different denominators and solve problems involving them

Pupils explain how to compare pairs of non-related fractions (converting to common denominators)

Use knowledge of multiplication and division to solve comparison and change problems.

History:

Anglo-Saxons and Vikings

We will recap previous learning on the Anglo-Saxons focusing on the theme of invasion and settlement. We will then link this to the Viking invasion of Britain and through looking at a range of artefacts we will investigate whether the Vikings were raiders, traders or settlers.
