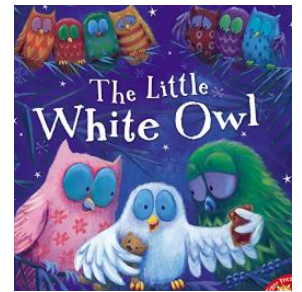

Main lesson:

Today we are going to be thinking about the word *JUDGE*.

Say this word out loud.

Clap it – how many syllables?

What spelling pattern can you see?

Have you heard of this word before? When?

What does it mean to judge something?

Try using it in a sentence e.g. The judge decided that the man was guilty of the crimes.

Little White owl was judged by his friends because he wasn't colourful. Have you ever done this? Judged or had an opinion about something/one before you even knew them/it.

Task: Write a sentence about a time when you judged something or someone but were wrong.
