LO: Plan the next chapter

Today you are going to plan the next chapter. I want you to consider the 3 main parts of a story. These will all need to be addressed within your chapter.

The 3 parts are:

1. Beginning: Everything is great. Describe the setting and how Iron Man feels in the scrapyard.
2. Middle:
 - a. Build up: Something happens. Don't tell the reader what it is yet. Use your skills with show not tell to keep the reader guessing. Things continue to get worse.
 - b. Problem: Reveal what the problem is. Give a character description if necessary.
3. Ending: Consider how the problem is resolved. Is it a happy or unexpected ending?

On the next page is a planning document you may use. You can print this if you are able to or replicate the lay out in your book.

You may choose to present your story plan in a different way as long as the three main sections are clear.

Once you have completed your plan, upload it to your portfolio or share with me in a message.

Structure of a short story: Plan

<p>Beginning: The Iron Man is happy at the scrapyard. What is he doing? Why does he like it. Describe the scrapyard.</p> <p><i>What do you need to tell your reader about the characters, setting and plot to keep them engaged?</i></p>	
<p>Middle</p> <p>Build up: Something happens at the scrapyard.</p> <p><i>What do you need to add to keep your reader interested? How can you build suspense/tension?</i></p>	
<p>Middle</p> <p>Problem: The problem is too big for the Iron Man.</p> <p><i>What is the event that occurs before the problem is solved and the readers' questions are answered?</i></p>	
<p>Ending (Resolution):</p> <p><i>How will you end so that the problem is resolved and satisfy the reader? Will you create an unexpected ending?</i></p>
