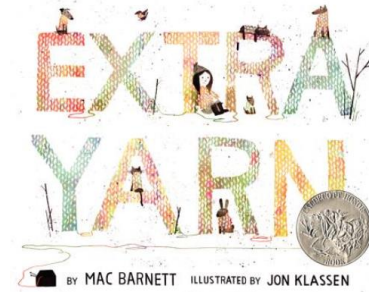
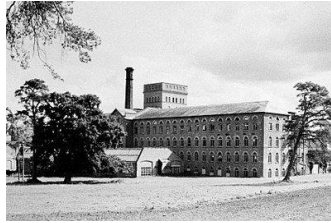











Home Challenges - Squirrels Class: Summer 1
