

## Writing: Inspiring people topic

### Session 7: LO: Writing the introduction to Captain Sir Tom Moore biography.

A biography has a set structure and must be in chronological order, but the presentation does not have to be boring.

Look at how these biographies have been set out. These are from a book called *Fantastically Great Women Who Changed the World* by Kate Pankhurst.

This is how we are going to try and present our biography about Captain Sir Tom Moore. At the end of each day, you will need to publish your paragraph. I'll show you how.

You will need to keep it, ready to create your final double page spread.



Today we are going to write the first and most important part of our biography.

We can use some of the facts we discovered last lesson and use the research notes from Session 5.

Remember the important success criteria for writing your introduction (see below).

Use it as an editing checklist after you have finished writing. Remember you can change your writing! Reading your writing aloud is a good place to start editing.

### **Plan it- write it- edit/ revise it- publish it!**

**Title:** Captain Sir Thomas Moore's biography written by \_\_\_\_\_.

**Subtitle:** Introducing Captain Sir Thomas Moore.

<b>Success criteria for introduction</b>	<b>Tick</b>
Who is the person? – say their name (real name also if their birth name is different)	
What are they are famous for? Say briefly why they are well known.	
When did it happen? Say when – date.	
Where did it happen? You may wish to say where the event or achievement happened.	
Why are they famous today?	

### **To think about:**

**Have you used a capital letter for the start of sentences and names?**

**Have you written in the third person and past tense?**

**Have you introduced Captain Sir Thomas Moore so your reader knows a little about him but wants to read on and find out more?**

**Have you kept your writing formal?**

**Have you published your writing?**
