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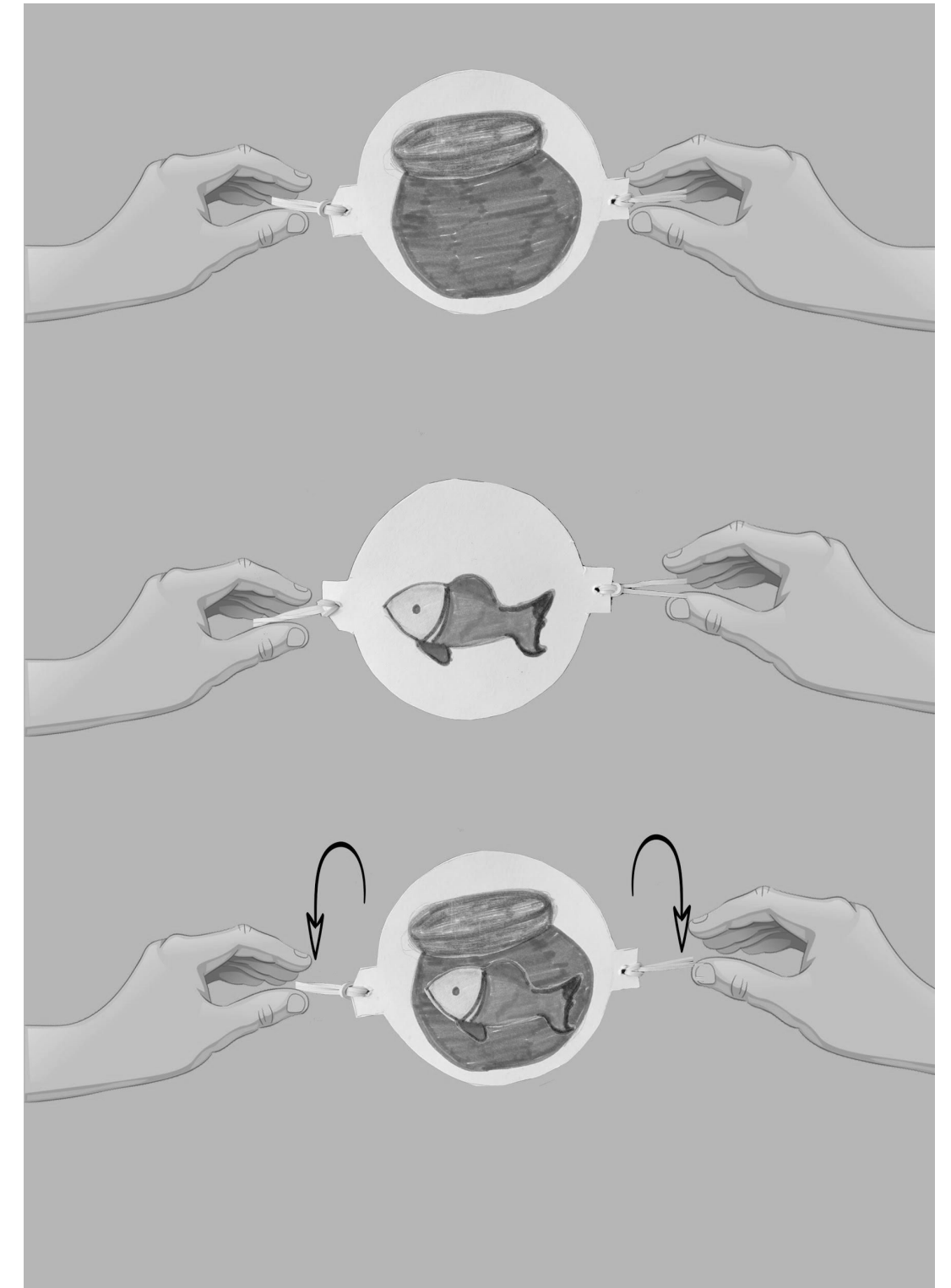


Task 1 - Create your own Thaumotrope

What you need:

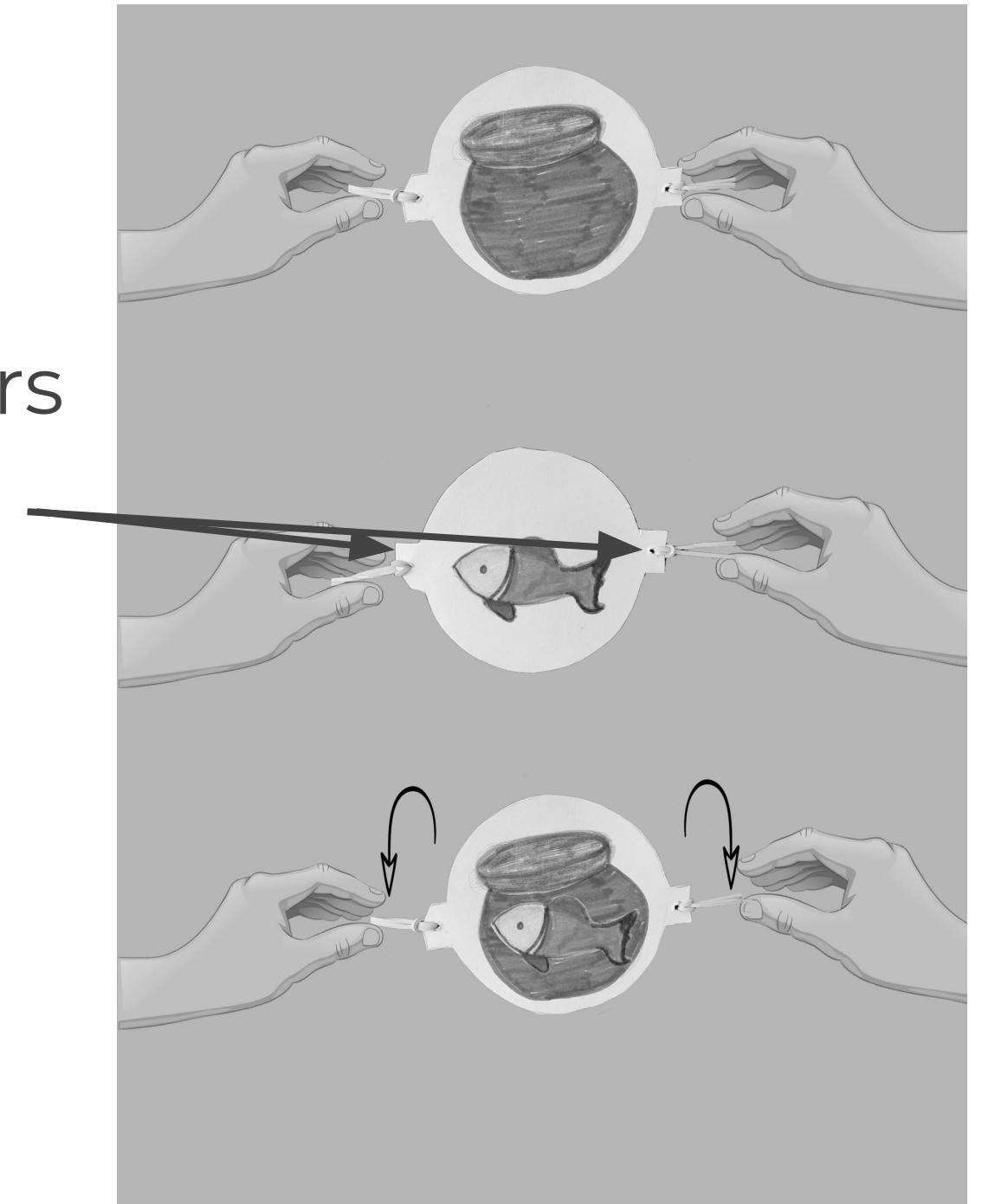
Card, pencil, lid to trace round (about 8 cm),
coloured crayons/ felt tip pens, scissors, string or
two elastic bands

1. Decide on two images that will make an interesting image when combined e.g. fish and fishbowl, bird and cage, butterfly and jar.
2. On the card, use your pencil to draw around the lid. Cut out the circular shape.



Task 1 - Create your own Thaumotrope (cont.)

3. Draw an image on one side of the circle and then flip it up over (horizontally) and draw your other image on the back of the card.
4. Ask an adult to help you use the tip of your scissors to make a small hole near the edge on opposite sides of the circle.
5. Thread elastic bands or string through the holes.
6. Spin the disk by twirling the bands or string between your thumb and index finger.
7. Your images should appear together



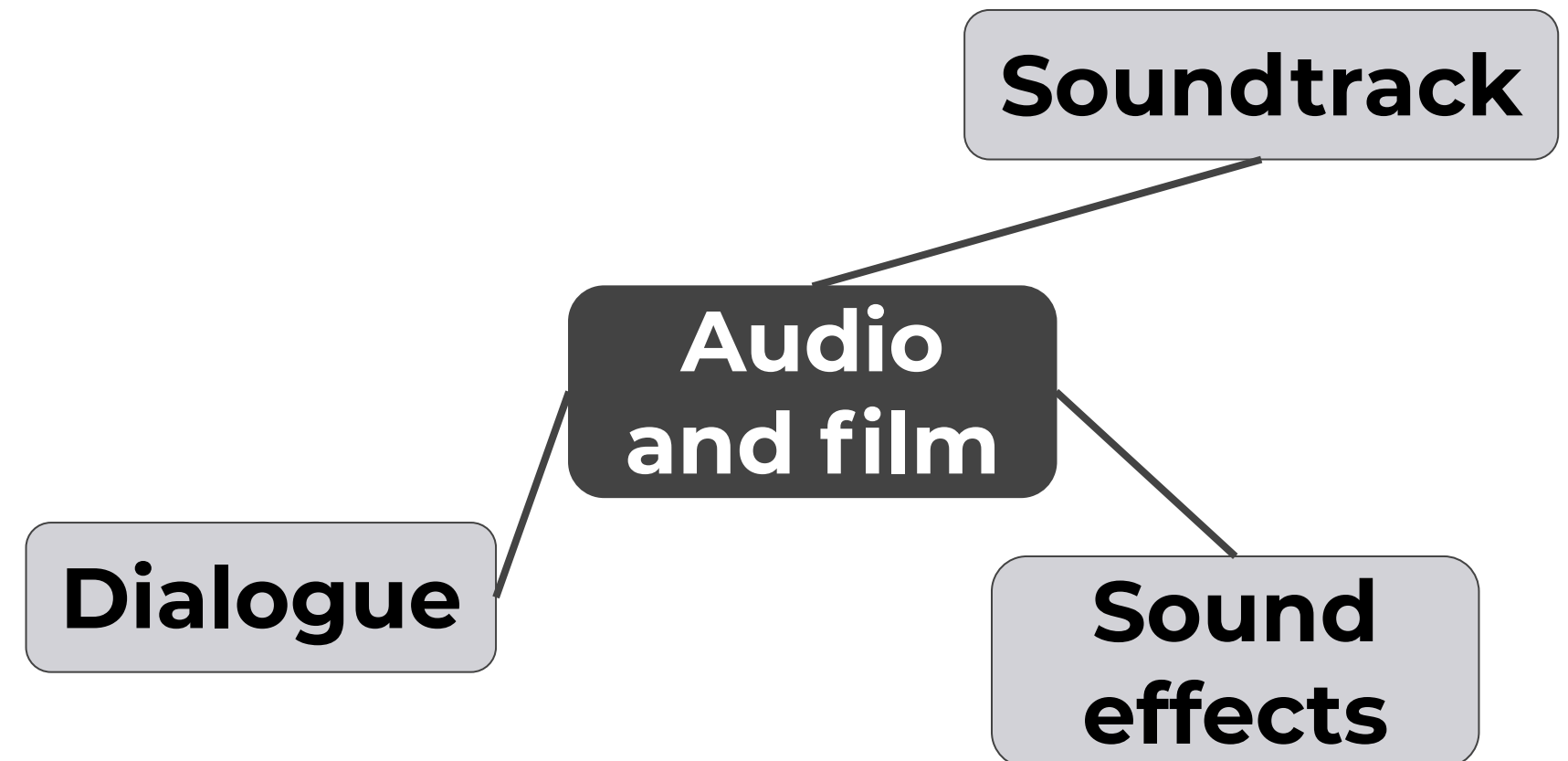
Task 2 - Audio and film

Create your own mind map based on audio and film.

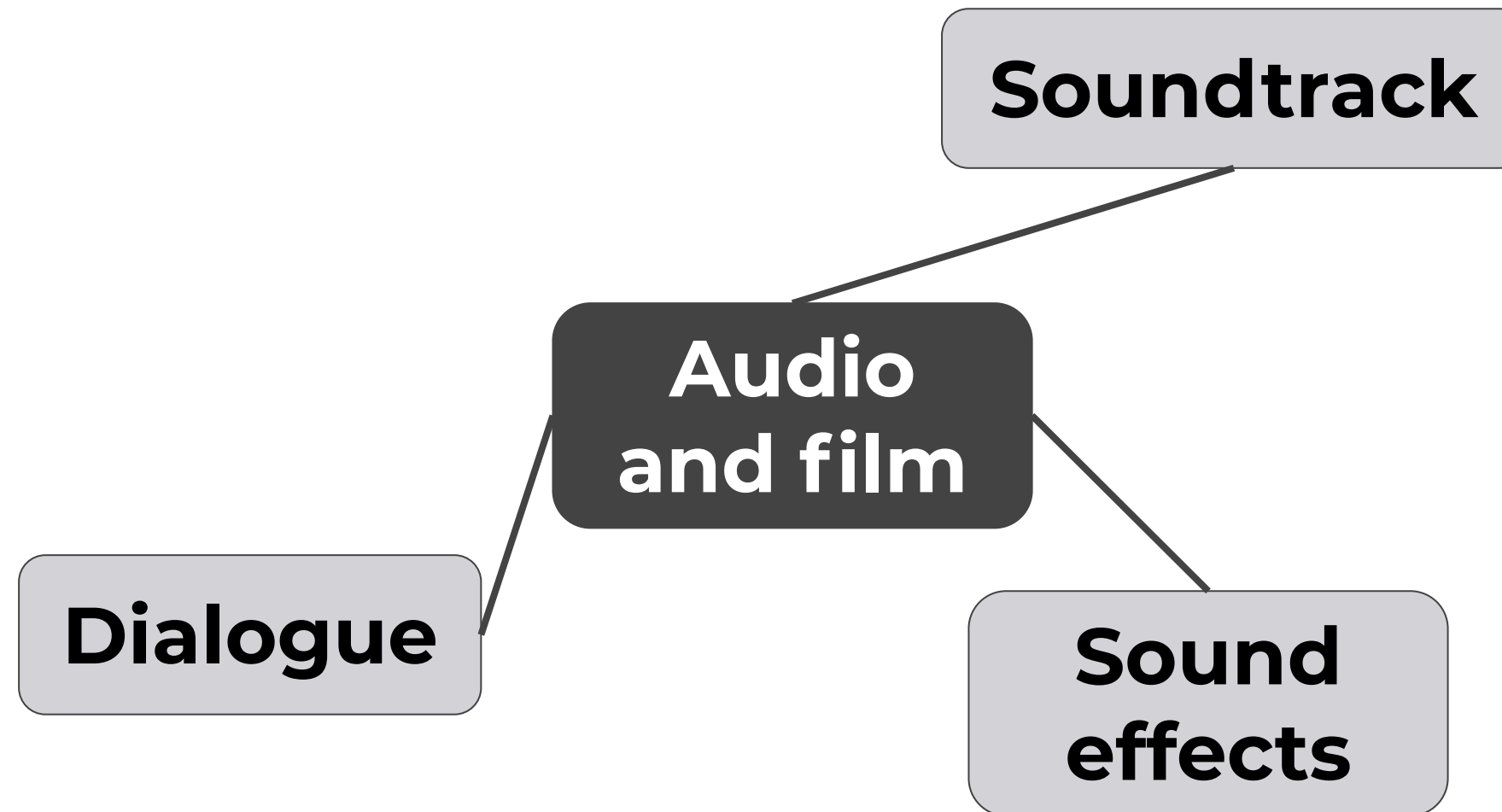
