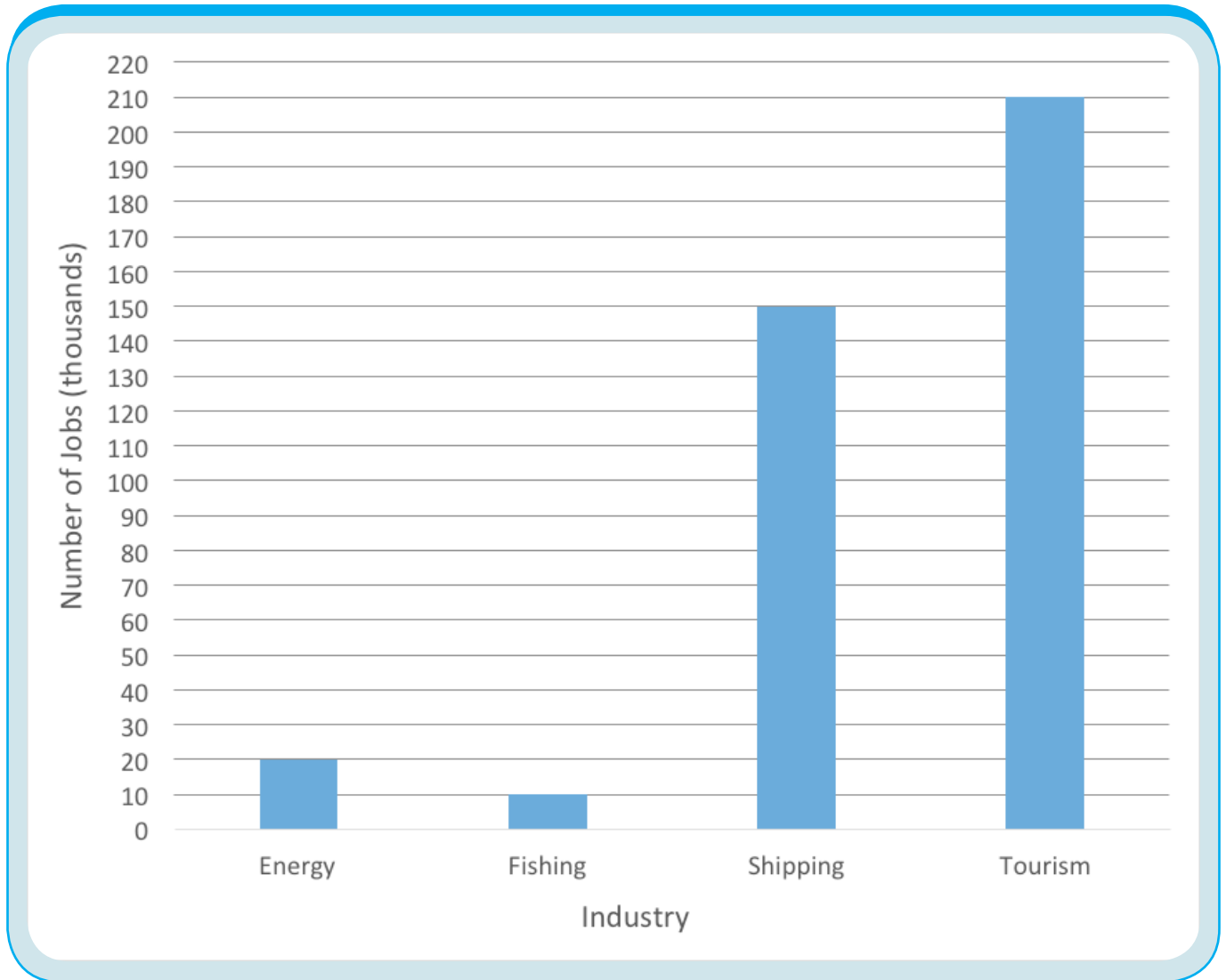


STUDENT SHEET 4b: HOW MUCH IS THE SEA WORTH? (7-9)

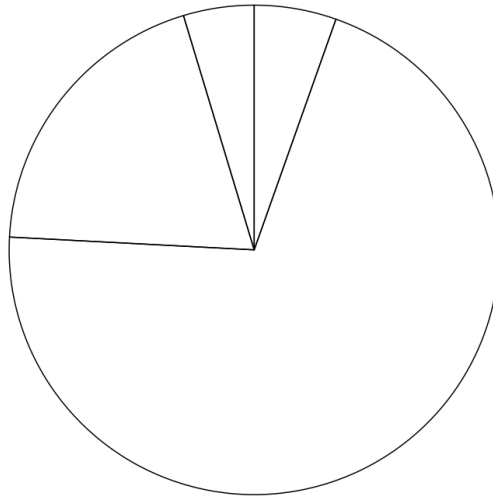
Value
