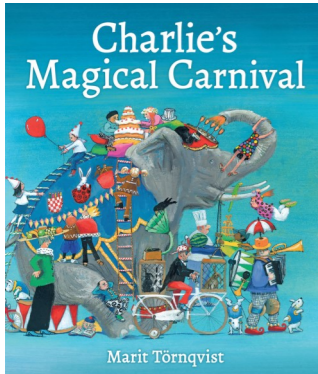

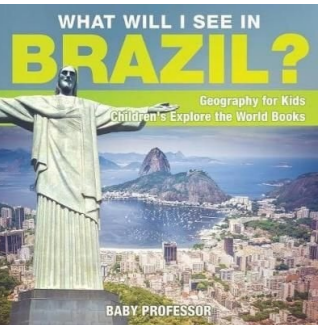

crown	The part of the tooth that sits above the gum.
dentine	The soft, slightly yellow layer under the tooth enamel.
