What was the outcome for humanity because of the first sin ?

Jesus

Realising that humanity/individuals have done wrong, God provided a solution to the problem and because Jesus (who was without sin) died in our place, humanity has a way of bridging the gap.

Jesus took the punishment for the sin of humanity, which was God's way of bridging the gap between God and humanity caused by sin.

When we own up to wrong doing this is confession of our mistakes (sin).

Christians believe to be forgiven is reconciliation between God and humanity.

A Christian will want to and try to live differently because they have been forgiven (repentance).

What might a Christian do differently because they have been forgiven by God?

- Think about acts of kindness/ 'good deeds' carried out by school as a way of demonstrating Christian faith in action.
- Food bank contributions, water aid support etc.
- If people who are not Christians would do this anyway, what is different about a Christian carrying out 'good deeds?'
- Christians believe Jesus is taking the punishment for their sin.
- How might this knowledge affect the way a Christian might live their life?
