


Home Challenges – Otter and Squirrel Class

<p>Can you write a secret message using the Celtic runes alphabet?</p> 	<p>Research Roman food and drink. Make something a Roman would have enjoyed eating. Take a photo and share the recipe with us.</p>	<p>Research Roman roads in Britain. Highlight Roman roads on a map of Somerset. Where is the closest Roman road to Wellington?</p>	<p>A Roman would have played music on a lyre or lute. Can you make your own string instrument?</p>	<p>The Celts loved brightly coloured clothes. Can you dye a white t-shirt using only natural dyes? i.e. beetroot</p>	<p>Make a mosaic name plate for your bedroom door. Bring it to school and we will laminate it. (We can provide squared paper for this- just ask)</p>
<p>Write a list of nouns that would be around in Roman Britain and decide which article – a or an- should go in front. i.e. a shield</p>	<p>Make <input type="checkbox"/> A laurel wreath (who would've worn this?) Or <input type="checkbox"/> A Roman soldiers helmet</p>	<p>Can you create a model or a labelled diagram of a Roman road? How did they build them? Do any still exist?</p>	<p>Make something a Celt or a Roman person may have worn.
