Piano Performances

If your child is interested in learning to play the keyboard or piano, I offer one-to-one lessons.

For younger children I use the Playing with Colour method, which simplifies learning to read music in a fun way. This is used as an initial stepping stone and later we move on to ordinary black notation.

Emphasis is on enjoyment and I therefore use a series of books that offer a large range of styles at each level, such as Popular, Favourites, Classics, Disney, Hits and Jazz & Blues. This enables children to choose pieces they will enjoy playing.

Lessons are 20 minutes long and cost £10. Payment is by direct debit, with the cost spread over the year, which results in a monthly payment of £27.50.

Children will need to get some books of their own, but I also provide some sheet music. Books can often be purchased second hand as there are many good copies available on the internet.

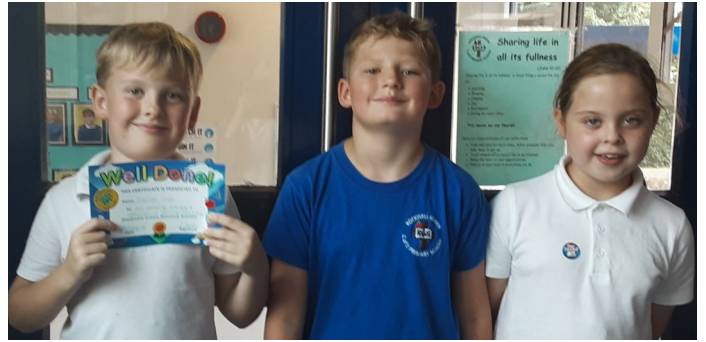

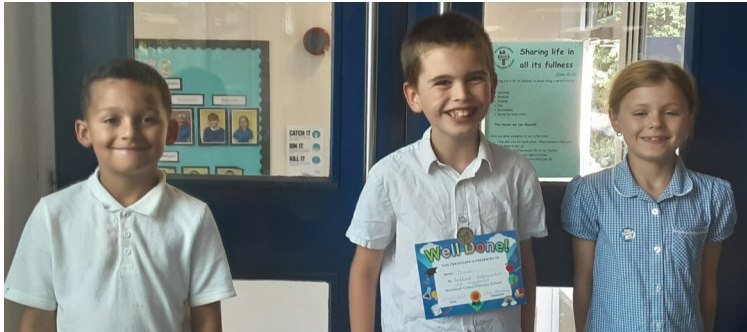
