






Hedgehogs and Kingfishers Home Challenges - Spring Term 2

<p>Butterfly label sound buttons</p> <p>There are many beautiful butterflies in the world, with wonderful names. Can you draw at least 4 different butterflies and label their names, adding sound buttons?</p>  <p>Peacock</p> <p>• _ _ _ •• _ _ _</p>	<p>Measure and compare weight</p> <p>Can you follow a recipe at home that involves measuring and weighing ingredients? Which was the heaviest ingredient, which was the lightest? What was the difference between them? Record what you weighed and draw a picture, send a photo or bring in the finished product.</p> 	<p>Butterfly poem</p> <p>Can you create a shape word picture about a butterfly? This could be a poem, butterfly names or facts, but can you present them to look like a butterfly?</p> 	<p>Stick measure and compare</p> <p>Find 5 sticks that you could compare the length of. Can you place them in order of shortest to longest. Can you then draw or photograph your measuring and record your lengths in centimetres in your book?</p> 	<p>The Long ee sound</p> <p>The word beanstalk has a long ee in the middle. How many words can you list that also have a long ee sound? Can you also sort the words according to how the ee sound is spelt, e.g. ee/ea/e/e_e /ie/y/</p> 	<p>Big count</p> <p>Go outside, this could just be your garden, and make a list of things you could count and record - e.g. types of birds, types of butterflies, types of trees, types of flowers, colours of cars, etc. What did you spot most and least of? How could you present your spots? Pictogram, graph, tally chart or list?</p>
